**Library Assignment**  
**Due Wednesday, October 8<sup>th</sup>**

On Wednesday, October 8<sup>th</sup>, you are required to turn in a bibliography of the material you may use for your research project.

Each of you has a project that focuses on the themes of this course, broadly conceived. That project fits into a larger body of work, into larger debates in the field, into larger questions of significance. What is that work? Who are the people who have published original research on your topic (primary sources) and who are the people who have commented on your topic (secondary material)?

The answer to these questions may take many forms. You may find material in the scientific literature (major research journals in the field). You may also find material in more popular scientific or cultural accounts (books or more popular scientific or cultural journals). Or, you may find material in the weeklies or dailies that are published for a much broader, non-scientific audience (*Time*, *Newsweek*, *New York Times*, *Bozeman Daily Chronicle*). And, you may find material online, in the form of blogs, webinars, Ted talks, and the like. Some of this material will be readily accessed; other material you may have to order through interlibrary loan.

You are required to create a bibliography of the sources you may use, broken down into these main categories:

- The Primary Literature
- Popular Scientific or Cultural Accounts
- More Popular Accounts
- Online Blogs and Other Social Chatter

You are then required to interlibrary loan material that is not available to you via our library or online.
