

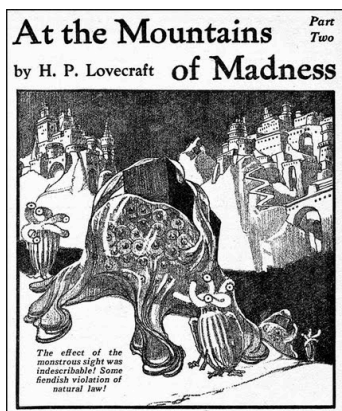

Luckily, ropes are not necessary. Neither is money.

Resources (books, articles, videos, microfilmed collections, dissertations, etc) not owned by MSU-Bozeman can usually be obtained for **free** (unless they are rare or fragile) through **Interlibrary Loan (ILL)**.

Because you are a student at MSU, you already have an ILLiad (Interlibrary Loan) account. To access it, go to the main MSU Libraries Web page <www.lib.montana.edu> and sign in using your **NetID** and password. The first time you use it, check your personal account information to adjust your preferences.

Log in each time you want to make a request, check the status of pending requests, or see your request history.

Remember to leave enough time to get items – usually between several days (for electronic articles) and 3 weeks (for items that have to go through regular mail), but sometimes longer for rarer items.

*** **Before** you request a book, video or other physical item through ILL, however, **be sure to search for it first in the MSU Libraries Catalog.**

*** **For journal articles, if MSU does own the print version (as opposed to online) of a journal, you can still request articles via ILL. We will scan those articles from our collection and send you a link to them within about 24 hours. For Free!**
